

# Musim Ban

If you were refused your immigrant visa application due to the travel ban and are determined to qualify for a waiver:



You may request your local embassy or consulate to reconsider your case within one year of the date of their waiver refusal without submitting a new application or paying a new visa application processing fee.

#### **TEMPORARY PROTECTED STATUS**

The following countries are currently designated for TPS:



- El Salvador
- Haiti
- Honduras
- Myanmar (Burma)
- Nepal
- Nicaragua

- Somalia
- Sudan
- South Sudan
- Syria
- Venezuela
- Yemen.

The future of TPS for many of these countries is not certain.

People should make sure to get the most up to date information about TPS designations.

### PUBLIC CHARGE

As of March 9, 2021, the Trump Administration's public charge rule is over.

New York City residents can access many health and social services including emergency Medicaid, food assistance, tenant protection, and free legal help. Your immigration status, ability to pay, and employment status do not matter.

CAN ICE MAKE
ARRESTS INSIDE OF
NYS COURTS?

No, ICE agents can no longer make arrests inside New York State courthouses without a judicial warrant or judicial order that authorizes the arrest and is signed by a judge.

In New York State, ICE can no longer arrest people at state, city and municipal courthouses, and they can no longer arrest people going to or leaving from state, city and municipal courthouses without judicial warrants.

These can include, criminal courts, family courts, and traffic courts, to name a few.







#### WHAT TO KNOW WHEN INTERACTING WITH ICE

- 1. Stay calm.
- 2. You have the right to remain silent.
- 3. If you speak to ICE, anything you say can be used against you.


4. You can record the situation with your phone or write down what happened after ICE leaves.



#### IF ICE IS AT YOUR DOOR



- You have the right to remain silent.
- You may state you **do not** consent to entry or search.
- You can tell them if there are children

or other vulnerable residents in your

home.




#### IF ICE IS INSIDE YOUR HOME

#### WHEN INTERACTING WITH ICE AT WORK

ICE <u>can</u> enter the **public space of a workplace** without needing any type of warrant.

ICE <u>cannot</u> legally enter the **private space of a workplace** without the permission of your employer or a judicial warrant.


- You have the right to remain silent.
- Your employers can ask ICE to show their identification and ask if ICE has a judicial warrant.



#### WHEN INTERACTING WITH ICE IN A PUBLIC SPACE


- Before responding with your name or anything else, you may ask, "Am I free to go?"
  - o If yes, then you can say:
    - "I'm going to be walking away now" and say "I am going to use my right to remain silent" and wait for an affirmation from the ICE officer
  - o If not, you can say:
    - "I am going to use my right to remain silent" or ask "Am I being detained?"





Remember that you also have the right to remain silent!

If an ICE officer tries to search your pockets or belongings, you can say "I do not consent to a search."




Remember that you also have the right to remain silent!

If an ICE officer tries to search your pockets or belongings, you can say "I do not consent to a search."

#### IF YOU ARE ARRESTED BY ICE

- There is no guarantee that an agent will speak your language.
- You have the right to remain silent.
- You can tell them if you have a medical issue or need to arrange for childcare.
- Do not lie or give false documents.
- People in the community can film ICE





#### YOUR RIGHTS WHEN ARRESTED BY ICE

- You have **the right** to an attorney and may ask to speak with your lawyer or take time to obtain an attorney.
- You have the right to call an attorney or your family.
- You have the right to be visited by an attorney in detention.
- Do not sign anything without speaking to an attorney first. You have the right to speak to a lawyer before you sign anything.
- You have the right to contact your consulate.









# RESOURCES IF YOUR LOVED ONE IS DETAINED

- You can use locator.ice.gov to find where your loved one is detained. You will need either:
  - Their country of birth and"A number"
  - or their country of birth,
     first name, last name, and
     date of birth

# RESOURCES IF YOUR LOVED ONE IS DETAINED

- To find out when and where your loved one's next hearing will take place, you can call the EOIR hotline at 1-800-898-7180 and inputting your loved one's A number.
- Each ICE facility has its own rules about visitation and sending money.
  - You can look up visitation and other information here:
    - ice.gov/detention-facilities, and call the jail to confirm that the information is still correct.

 The New York Immigrant Family Unity Project (NYIFUP) provides free, highquality legal representation to every low-income immigrant facing deportation in the City of New York, as well as to detained New Yorkers facing deportation in the nearby immigration courts in New Jersey.

QUESTIONS AND
REMEMBER:



- Ask for proof of license/accreditation. Only a lawyer or accredited person can give you legal advice.
- Get a second opinion
- Only go to providers that have a physical location
- Ask for a written agreement of services to be provided
- Do not pay for government application forms
- Ask for a written receipt
- Keep originals and copies
- Do not sign blank/incomplete forms or anything you don't fully understand

## COVID-19 RESOURCES

All New Yorkers should get tested for COVID-19.

- If you already **tested negative** but start to have symptoms, you should get another test.
- If you test positive, you will receive a call from a Tracer.

Testing sites.






All health insurance plans must cover COVID-19 testing without any out-of-pocket payments.

NYS Emergency Medicaid covers COVID-19 testing and treatment without any out-of-pocket payments for low-income uninsured residents, including undocumented immigrants.

#### COVID-19 TREATMENT

There are now 3 vaccines approved for use: Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson & Johnson/Janssen.

The vaccine is <u>free</u> to all New Yorkers, regardless of immigration status.

- You do not need to share your immigration status
- Your privacy will be protected

COVID-19 vaccinations are now required for all immigration processing that require medical examinations by a civil surgeon (Ex. legal permanent residency, etc.)



#### COVID-19 VACCINE APPOINTMENTS

#### How do I get vaccinated?

- 1. Make an appointment using <u>vaccinefinder.nyc.gov</u> or by calling **1-877-829-4692**. Some locations take walkups.
- 2. Select your preferred site to see available appointments.
  - a. Some sites can be booked online and some need to be called directly. This is specified on the Vaccine Finder.
- 3. Fill out any required forms (this may be different depending on which site you choose.)
- 4. Second dose appointments will be scheduled after you receive your first does.
  - a. Your second dose is about 1 month later and must be done at the same location.
